Employee & Appointee Report & Instruction:

- 1. Mr. Coe reported that he has received many calls about small parcels in the Township for building sites; and is in the process of issuing a building permit on Blacksnake Road.
- 2. Mr. McDaniel reported that he dragged Horns Hill Road and Angeletti Lane; picked up the repaired hydraulic cylinder for the Township's grader; cleaned catch basin on Stickle Road; and cleaned up limbs along the Township's roads.
- 3. Mr. Shaw reported that the Township is all set to receive the grant money from the ODOT Township Stimulus Program for the guardrail project on Stout Road. He spoke with the Licking County Prosecutor's Office about using the Federal ARPA money to help purchase a new truck to replace the 1998 Louisville dump truck. The Prosecutor informed him that the Township could use the ARPA money to purchase a new truck for the Township as long as they adopt a resolution adopting the standard allowance for revenue loss for government services during the Covid 19 pandemic. Mr. Shaw also reported that he received the contract for the 2022-2023 ODOT Salt Purchasing Program.

- 2. The Board discussed adopting a standard allowance resolution for the disbursement of the ARPA money the Township has received.
- 3. Resolution 22-15 Mr. Parsons moved to adopt the standard allowance in the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 which provides an estimate of revenue loss as part of the Covid 19 pandemic. Seconded by Mr. Smith. Vote: Mr. Parsons, yes; Mr. Smith, yes; Mr. Stevenson, yes. Motion carried.
- 4. The Board discussed the amount of salt the Township will need for the 2022-2023 winter season.
- 5. Resolution 22-16 Mr. Smith moved to contract with the ODOT Salt Purchasing Program for 275 tons of salt for the 2022-2023 winter season. Seconded by Mr. Parsons. Vote: Mr. Smith, yes; Mr. Parsons, yes; Mr. Stevenson, yes. Motion carried.
