New Business:

- 1. The Licking County Commissioners announced that they will vote, on a resolution to prohibit large commercial solar and wind farms in Washington Township, on August 29, at 9:45 AM.
- 2. Mr. Dale Arnold, Ohio Farm Bureau, will provide a 20-minute presentation to the Trustees on October 28 regarding solar and wind installations.
- 3. Two organizations have been contacted regarding employee health benefits. Mrs. Shipley will be working with both to pursue feasibility.
- 4. The Trustees are reviewing the compensation package for the work on the Zoning resolution
- 5. The Trustees have begun discussion of the prioritization of projects and equipment purchases for 2025.
- 6. The salt contract has been finalized and is less for 2024-25 (\$65.90 per ton)
- 7. The State of Ohio has announced grants of \$94.5 million dollars to 23 counties for broadband technology. Licking County was NOT included, but Knox county got an additional grant.
