

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE

NOVEMBER 10, 1933.

Present: Moore. Smoots and Kirkpatrick. ✓

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Motion by Kirkpatrick, seconded by Smoots, that we pay labor 40¢ per hour or \$3.20 per day for 8 hours per day; Teams 62½¢ or \$5.00 per day for 8 hours, this arrangement effective only so long as the State Relief Director compels us to pay 40¢ per hour for relief labor. Carried. ✓

Mrs. Frances Torrens presented her claim for one sheep killed by dogs, and after examining Homer Armstrong and Wilbur Reynolds, appraisers, the Trustees certified \$4.00 as the amount due.
