The Washington Township Board of Trustees met in regular session at the Township Office for the purpose of transacting the business of the Township.

Present for the meeting were trustees: Torrens, Wince and Londot.

Having viewed the tractors offered in bids from last meeting Mr. Londot submitted the following motion: That the Trustees of Washington Township accept the bid of the Moore's Farm Stor, Inc. for a Allis-Chalmers tractor, mower and loader at the bid of \$4596.75. Mr. Wince seconded the motion. Roll call Torrens, yes Wince, yes Londot, yes. President declared the motion adopted.

The Clerk was instructed to write the unsuccessful bidders informing them of the Boards decision and also to Thank them for their bids.

Mr. Wince submitted the following resolution and moved it's adoption: Whereas, Washington Township have purchased a tractor, mower and loader to be delivered on June 23, 1966 and must be paid for at the next regular meeting to be held July 5, 1966, and Whereas, there is not sufficient funds in the treasury to meet current expenses and make complete payment of equipment, Therefore, be it resolved, That Washington Township borrow from the First National Bank, Utica, Ohio, the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) for the period of two years, at a rate of interest per annum not to exceed that which is allowed by law. MOTion was seconded by Mr. Londot. Roll Call Torrens, yes Wince, yes Londot, yes. President declared the motion adopted.

Meeting adjourned on motion of Mr. Londot and seconded of Mr. Wince.
