

# RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

Minutes of

The Board of Trustees of Washington Township

Meeting

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Held April 25, 1977

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The Washington Township Board of Trustees met in regular session this date for the purpose of transacting the business of the Township.

Present-Trustees: James W. Torrens, George F. Wince, Jack T. Londot.  
Clerk; John E. Kinney and Road Supt.: Myers W. Hull.

The minutes of the April 11th meeting were read and approved.

A letter was received from the Licking County Prosecuting Attorney relative to Section 519.21 of the Ohio Revised Code as amended, and effective Aug. 9, 1976.

The last paragraph of this Section states as follows:

" Such section does not confer any power on any Township Zoning Commissions, Board of Township Trustees or Boards of Zoning Appeals to prohibit the use of any land owned or leased by an industrial firm for the conduct of oil or natural gas well drilling or production activities or the location of associated facilities or equipment when such oil or natural gas obtained by the industrial firm is used for the operation of its own plants".

It was further explained that the legislature had seen fit to eliminate this activity from the control that was heretofore vested with local Zoning Boards and other Zoning bodies.

Notice was received from the Office of Revenue Sharing advising that the Antirecession Assistance fourth quarter payment to Washington Township would be \$445.00.

Notice was received from the Office of Revenue Sharing relative to the General Revenue Sharing allocation for Washington Township for the 9th Entitlement Period covering from Oct. 1, 1977 to Sep. 30, 1978. The estimated allocation is \$10,223.00.

The Trustees had received complaints from five residents living on Weaver Road of Washington Township that eight pigs belonging to the family of Clarence Redd were running at large and causing damage to their property. All three trustees had contacted the owners on April 16, 1977 and advised that the pigs be confined.

The pigs were again reported to be running at large on April 24 and 25 and were again advised that the pigs must be confined. At this time the pigs were confined in a building.
