
The minutes of the meeting held April 27, 1987 were read and approved.

Doug Mill was present at our meeting representing the Shelly Co. Mr. Mill confirmed the quotes given previously to Mr. Torrens and advised that his firm did work for Harrison Township. He invited our Board to travel to Harrison Township to view the work being done on Wednesday May 13, 1987. He felt this would give our Board a better understanding of how the roads are covered. Mr's Wince and Hull plan to make the viewing. One concern the Board had was whether the liquid would cure in laid over recent salt water application. Mr. Mill would find out and advise.

Mr. Torrens reported further on the plowing of Township Road #203. It was first thought that Mr. Bullock had plowed only a portion of the road while he was plowing his fields, however after inspection it was found to be a deliberate act. Mr. Bullock lowered his plow and plowed right up the middle of the road. It was decided that the Board should send a letter to Mr. Bullock with the explanation that he will be billed for the repair.

The Board reported on their viewings to the Rice and Bell property and to the Willis property. They reported no major problems and easy solutions have been found.

The Board also discussed the financial difficulty the Township faces with the cutback of Federal Revenue Sharing. It was mentioned that the Village may not vote on a levy if one was put on the ballot. The County Prosecutor will be contacted concerning this.

The Road Supt. reported that his hospitalization had paid very little of his recent charges for himself and his family. Alternatives can hopefully be found.

Mr. Torrens moved that the meeting be adjourned with Mr. Wince seconding the motion. Vote; Hull, Wince, Torrens, Yea.
