Meeting

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Held July 17, 1989

After reviewing the proposed budget for the year commencing Jan. 1, 1990, Mr. Wince moved the budget be accepted as proposed., seconded by Mr. Torrens.

Mr. Torrens stated that he felt when our Issue 2 funding request is submitted that we should request more funds than we originally planned. After discussing the situation with Jerry Wray, who offered his support in any way, it was felt we should not shortchange ourselves.

Mr. Torrens also reported that ODOT has stated the St. Louisville bridge repair bid would be let out as early as Sept. Depending on the bid winner the job could start immediately. They further stated they would only close one lane at a time.

Mr. Torrens also attended a meeting concerning the Licking River's threat to St. Louisville and its property owners. The Army Corp of Engineer's reps were present and agreed to do a study as to cause and solution, however they stated no funding was available from them.

The Clerk brought a depository contract submitted by BancOhio National Bank Mr. Wince moved that the contract be accepted, seconded by Mr. Torrens.

Mr. Torrens reminded that the auction will be this Saturday at Newton. Mr. Hull will transport the sale items to Newton Saturday.

Mr. Wince moved the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Mr. Torrens.
