1. The Clerk reported that he had received the second half of the Ohio Employment Services penalties for the late reports from 1988 through 1992. The Clerk replied to the State of Ohio asking for abatement of these penalties due to the fact that the former Clerk was not aware he was to do these reports.
2. Roger Beaver and Trisha Ware reported to the Trustees that there had been two wrecks on Stout Rd. near Mrs. Ware's home. There is a curve in the road at that point. Mrs. Ware also expressed some fear that a car could come off the road and hit her house if something is not done about this curve.

The Trustees discussed this problem and will begin by putting up a warning sign and a suggested speed limit sign of 25 MPH. They will also look into the cost of putting up guard rail at that point.
3. Mary Brilla asked the Trustees about driveway culverts on Bell Church Rd. and also informed them that she would take any extra dirt produced from the rehabilitation project to start late this summer.
4. Mr. Torrens reported that the Merchants Association asked if they could use the Township office for Art displays during the Village's May Day Celebration. The Trustees OK'd this request


