1. Resolution 93-05 - Mr. Hull moved that the 1994 budget totalling over \$250,000.00 be approved as is, seconded by Mr. Londot, vote unanimous.
2. Virginia Wear contacted the Trustees about putting a pool and fence on her property. They referred her to Jim Dixon, zoning inspector. Mrs. Wear also complimented the Trustees on:
  - solving the problem with the curve on Stout Road
  - keeping the weeds mowed down
  - and keeping the road in good condition.
3. Resolution 93-06 - Mr. Torrens moved the following:
 

" We the Trustees of Washington Township strongly oppose the placement of a correctional facility within or near the boundaries of the Township. It is apparent that an overwhelming majority of the Township residents, including local businessmen, likewise object to the location of the Moundview Youth Center at its proposed site.

We find no advantage of its placement at the Blacksnake Road location while many disadvantages are quite apparent. First and foremost, the community as a whole believe a correctional facility will be harmful to the future land values and potential community growth. Furthermore, the cost of services which will be required by the facility, such as police, fire and emergency medical protection, will far exceed any revenues generated by the facility. Also, mainstreaming the inmates into the North Fork Schools will only add an additional burden on an already financially troubled school district. Finally, it is quite apparent that a correctional facility should not be located in or near a residential area.

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
We believe that forcing the Moundview Youth Center on the Utica community is unjust and unwarranted.




Seconded by Mr. Londot, vote unanimous.
