The Washington Township Board of Trustees met this date in regular session for the purpose of transacting business of the Township.



1. Resolution 94-05 -

Mr. Torrens moved that the Board of Trustees of Washington Township, Licking County, continue the agreement with Velvet Ice Cream Company and the Licking County Planning Commission continuing the enterprise zone within Washington Township, Licking County, Ohio. Seconded by Mr. Coad, vote unanimous.

2. The Board reported that the Licking County Township Association is having a seminar on the new OSHA regulations that will affect our Township. The Trustees are interested in attending this seminar.

3. Jerry Hull reported that he has called Dan Frazee five times and has not received any reply to date.

4. Mr. Coad reported that he would contact Jeff Moran of LBJ Drilling Company to see if he could apply brine to the Township's roads.

5. Jerry Hull reported that the Township's dump truck has a bad starter and is being rebuilt at the present time.

6. Mr. Coad reported that the Township's Case mowing tractor is broken down again; they believe the rear-end is out. The <sup>first</sup> estimate to repair is between \$3500 to \$5000. Mr. Hull added

that this tractor cost the Township too much money in repairs and that it was time for the Township to replace it with a new tractor and mower.

7. The Board will meet with B & B Tractor, Inc. Tuesday, June 14, 1994 to get a firm estimate on repairs to the Township's Case tractor; and to get prices on a used tractor, and new tractors and mowers. This will give them a better idea whether or not they will put out bids for a new tractor and mower.
8. Township residents have complained that Richards Road needs to be mowed and that the ditches are too deep. Jerry Hull is planning to mow Richards Road tomorrow (6/14/94).
9. Mr. Torrens reported that Don Glover, Eden Township Trustee, contacted him about four to five townships getting together to purchase a pavement patching machine from the Licking County Highway Department. The Trustees would like to look at the machine before making any decision on this matter.
10. Mr. Torrens reported that United Telephone Co. would like to bury telephone cable under Weaver Road near Torrens' home. The Trustees will contact United Telephone and look into the matter before granting permission.

Mr. Hull moved to adjourn, seconded by Mr. Coad, vote unanimous.
